The following are some of the key truths and practices of the people who gather to The Lords Name in the West End Gospel Hall, Whitburn:

1. We adhere uncompromisingly to the fundamentals of the Christian Faith

Such doctrines as: a) The Divine inspiration of Holy Scripture, the Bible (II Timothy 3 v 16)

b) Our God is 3 eternally equal Persons in one Godhead (I John 5 v 7)

c) The virgin birth of our Lord Jesus Christ (Luke 1 vv 26-38)

d) The literal death & bodily resurrection of our Lord (I Corinthians 15)

e) The universe created by God's spoken word (Hebrews 11 v 3)

2. We preach a full and sound Gospel to all

Proclaiming that: a) All have sinned therefore need to be saved (Romans 3 v 23)

b) All must repent of their sins before God (Acts 3 v 19)

c) Christ died for our sins and rose again (I Corinthians 15 v 3-4)

d) Salvation is only found in The Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 4 v 12)

e) Eternal Life is received by Faith through Grace (John 3 v 16)

f) Eternal punishment for rejecting God's Son (John 3 v 36)

g) Once saved we are forever saved (John 10 v 28-29)

3. We acknowledge the importance of Christian Baptism

This involves: a) Only born again believers are baptised (Acts 8 v 37)

b) Only baptism by total immersion is practised (Acts 8 v 38)

c) Declaration of our walking in newness of life (Romans 6 v 4)

d) Living our lives no longer practising sin (Romans 6 v 6)

4. We acknowledge the importance of 'The Breaking of Bread' to remember HIM

This involves: a) Only baptised believers breaking bread (Acts 2 v 41- 42)

b) Breaking Bread every first day of the week (Acts 20 v 7)

c) The gathering purpose is remembrance (I Corinthians 11 v 23-25)

d) Being open for witnessing by others (I Corinthians 11 v 26)

e) Never participating lightly or impurely (I Corinthians 11 v 27- 29)

5. We lay emphasis on the individual responsibility of each assembly & it's members

This means: a) Having no regional or national organisation (Revelation 1-3)

b) Each assembly having its own leaders/overseers (Acts 20 v 28)

c) The assembly is accountable only to Christ (Hebrews 13 v 17)

d) Recognising the roles of audible men & silent women (I Timothy 2)

e) Honouring the headship of Christ (I Corinthians 11 v 1- 16)

f) Exercising all the gifts given to all the men (Ephesians 4 v 11- 13)

g) Accepting that the sign gifts have ceased (I Corinthians 13 v 8)

6. We appreciate the distinctive Christian hope of The Lords coming again

Believing: a) The certainty of his coming (John 14 v 3)

b) The change in us at his coming (Philippians 3 v 21)

c) The catching up of living & raised believers (I Thessalonians 4 v 16- 17)

d) This coming is before any 'Tribulation Period' (I Thessalonians 1 v 10)
